Annie and her husband Andy Wendell have been producing this show since the spring of 2000 from their home studio Solon, Maine. Her husband Andy is the Engineer, Director and Technical Adviser for the radio show. Next March they will celebrate the program's ten year anniversary. The General Store Variety Show has been compared to Garrison Keillor's A Prairie Home Companion, but Maine-style and from a woman's point of view. The show is currently sponsored by Polar Bear and Company Publishers.

Both Annie and Andy have their own live radio shows at WMHB. They also play music together and find time to act in local plays, which makes for quite a creative team! Annie has been a licensed DJ since 1974, and has written several books, proving herself to be a talented Author as well.
